The President's Message

Today is December 1. It seems the news this past week has been full of the passing of significant political figures from my youth – Rosalyn Carter, Henry Kissinger and now Sandra Day O'Connor. Meanwhile, a CEO says companies that have pulled advertisements from his platform are "black-mailing" him and a congressman accused of misuse of finances claims those who will hold him accountable are "bullies." 
